

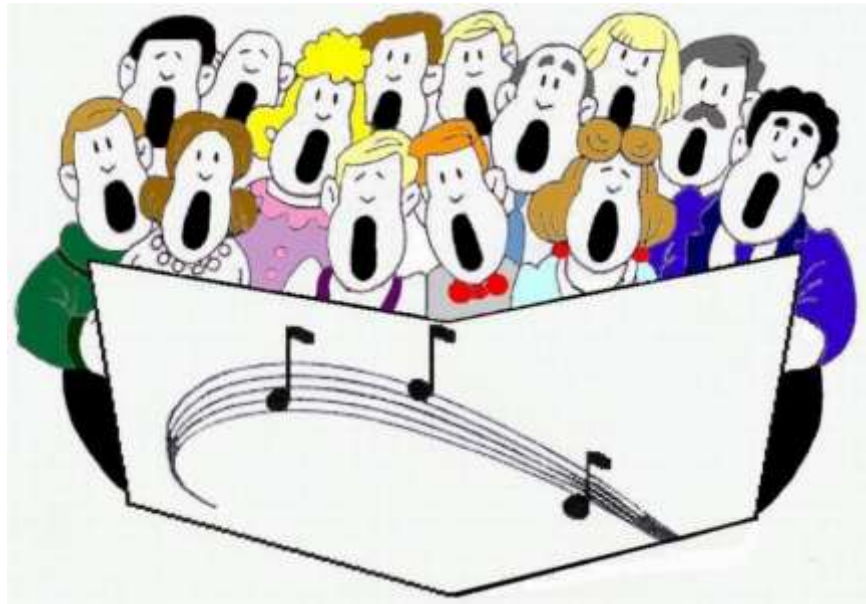

## Choral Society Concert



The Maidstone Journal reported that ***“The Chislehurst Choral Society sang a selection of glees, madrigals and songs in the School-room for the entertainment of the tradespeople and poor of the parish.”***

The programme included two violin solos by ***“Mr. Raymant, the talented violinist of the village”*** and the ***“unparalleled comic singing of Mr. Williams, this gentleman causing no little expansion of the sides with laughter.”***
